Overview of Tools

Rubric for Assessing Extensiveness of State Medicaid Adult Dental Benefits (Rubric)

A <u>survey tool</u> that defines an extensive Medicaid adult dental benefit <u>and</u> assesses the extensiveness of existing coverage within each state.

Medicaid Adult Dental Coverage Checker (Coverage Checker)

An interactive tool that displays state-by-state results of the Rubric.

The results represent a snapshot in time and are reflective of coverage offered by each state.

The <u>Coverage Checker</u> displays information from 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024 Rubric.




The Rubric

What it is:

 A survey to be completed by state Medicaid dental directors and/or staff.

What it does:

- Defines an extensive Medicaid adult dental benefit.
- Assesses the extensiveness of existing coverage within each state's Medicaid program.





Definition of an Extensive Medicaid Adult Dental Benefit

An extensive dental benefit is one that provides coverage for a range of dental procedures considered adequate for the prevention of disease and promotion of oral health; the restoration of oral structures to health and function; and the treatment of emergency/urgent conditions for the largest group of Categorically Needy Medicaid adult beneficiaries ages 21-64 covered by a state's Medicaid program.

To meet this definition, states must:

- cover specific procedures and services, including allowed frequency, in eight specific service categories; and
- have an annual benefit maximum greater than or equal to \$1,000.

Annual benefit maximum

Diagnostic services

Preventive services

Restorative services

Endodontic services

Periodontal services

Prosthodontic services

Extraction services


What it is:

An interactive tool that displays state-by-state results of the Rubric.

The results display benefits on a continuum from no benefits to extensive.


The Medicaid Adult Dental Coverage Checker

The Coverage Checker contains three main sections:

- Map with responses by survey question/measure <u>and</u> benefits continuum with points received by survey question/measure by state
- Time trends (2020, 2022, 2023, 2024)
- Additional 2024 Benefit/Program Information

<u>Hover</u> over the Lightbulb icon and the following informational 'Tool Tip' will pop up.

<u>Click</u> on the Lightbulb icon and the 2024 Rubric survey and user guide will open.




Click on the Time Trends icon and you will be taken to a new screen with data from 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024.

Section One:

Map with responses by survey question/measure

- This is the initial screen you will see when you visit the Coverage Checker.
- Use the drop-down menu on the top right side of the screen to <u>click</u> on a specific survey question/measure.
- The map <u>and</u> the continuum below will change to reflect that specific question/measure.

Please note: A state's Medicaid adult dental benefits program is considered 'Extensive' if it receives a total of 19 points or greater, does not receive a '0' in any question/measure, and receives a '4' or '6' in Question 1 (Annual Benefit Max).

Section One:

Map with responses by measure/survey question (cont'd)

- Use the drop-down menu on the top right side of the screen to <u>click</u> on a specific survey question/measure.
 Then <u>hover</u> over a state to view survey responses to that question/measure.
- The map will change to reflect the specific question/measure selected.

This is an example of Alaska's response to the Annual Benefit Maximum question/measure.

When you hover over Alaska, you will see the survey responses to this question/ measure for 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024.


The continuum below will change so that you can see each state's response to the Annual Benefit Maximum question/measure in 2024.

Section One:

Benefits continuum with points received by survey question/ measure by state

- Use the drop-down menu on the top right side of the screen to <u>click</u> on a specific survey question/measure.
- Use the drop-down menu on the middle right side of the screen to select:
 - 'All' states;
 - States that 'Do not offer extensive benefits overall in 2024;' or
 - States that 'Offer extensive benefits overall in 2024.'




Section One:

Benefits continuum with points received by survey question/ measure by state (cont'd)

- Use the drop-down menu on the top right side of the screen to <u>click</u> on a specific survey question/measure.
- Use the scroll bar within the continuum to select your state.
- <u>Click</u> on the color bar to see additional information about the survey question/ measure.
- Click on 'Navigate to Additional 2024
 Benefit/Program Information
 Dashboard' or 'View Coverage
 Document' for more information about
 the state.

This is an example of Nebraska's response to the Complete Dentures question/measure.

Clicking on the green bar, you will see that Nebraska responded to this question/measure with a '1' indicating that they cover complete dentures once per five years or less frequently.




Time Trends – line graph



<u>Click</u> on the Home icon and you will be redirected to the main page (Section One) of the 2024 Coverage Checker.



<u>Click</u> on the Notebook icon and you will be taken to a new tab with Additional Benefit/Program Information (Section Three).



Time Trends – line graph

- Allows you to view changes for all or specific states for 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024.
- Allows you to view changes for all or specific questions/measures for 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024.
- Use the drop-down box in the 'Select state' feature to choose 'All' or a specific state.
- Use the drop-down box in the 'Select measure' feature to choose 'All' or a specific question/ measure, respectively.



Time Trends – line graph (cont'd)

This is an example of how coverage of fillings has changed over time in Kansas.


In 2020, Kansas did not cover fillings. They responded to the survey with a '0' in this question/measure to indicate as such.

In 2022, Kansas provided coverage of fillings. They responded to the survey with a '2' in this question/measure to indicate as such. This level of coverage continued in 2023 and 2024.



Time Trends – continuum

- Allows you to view changes for all or specific states for 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024.
- Allows you to view changes for all or specific questions/measures for 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024.
- Use the drop-down box in the 'Select state' feature to choose 'All' or a specific state.
- Use the drop-down box in the 'Select measure' feature to choose 'All' or a specific question/ measure.
- Use the scroll bar to move to listings by year – 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024.



Time Trends – continuum (cont'd)

This is an example of how overall coverage in Minnesota has changed over time.

In 2020, Minnesota received a total of 26 points based on their responses to the survey. At that time, they did not offer coverage in each of the 14 survey questions/measures.

In 2024, Minnesota received a total of 31 points based on their responses to the survey. As of December 31, 2024, they offer coverage in each of the 14 survey questions/measures.

Additional Information State

Adults age 21 and older are not eligible for dental coverage through Medicaid.

Alabama

Effective October 1, 2022, Alabama Medicaid covers dental services for pregnant adult recipients (over 21). Coverage is effective during pregnancy and through the end of the month of 60 days postpartum.

Alaska Medicaid Adult Dental Coverage

- Covers two categories for adult recipients (age 21 and older):
- Adult Emergency Dental Services

This information can be accessed via the 'Additional Benefits' tab or by clicking on the Notebook icon when you are in the Time Trends tab (Section Two) of the 2024 Coverage Checker.
