We believe that JEDI is a process that requires continual reflection and commitment that is best understood through aligned action at the micro and macro levels.

- Diverse membership of oral health system stakeholders








### **OPEN's Grassroot Definition**







### Political Landscape Updates

H.R. 1, The One Big Beautiful Bill Act, passed on July 4, including deep cuts to Medicaid that will have lasting impacts on oral health care access

### **Agency Cuts:**

- Elimination of the CDC's Division of Oral Health
- Elimination of HRSA's Chief Dental Officer
- Reductions in NIH oral health research.

### Fluoride:

- Water fluoridation ban passed in two states: Utah and Florida
- FDA action on fluoride supplements for children



### **OPEN Mentor Program**



### **Mentors**

Who they are: Seasoned OPEN members, not necessarily formal leaders, who understand the network well and are willing to support new members.

Mentors will receive a brief training on OPEN resources and connections available



### **Mentor Interest Form**

Name and pronouns

### **New Members (Mentees)**

Automatically receive a welcome email upon joining OPEN

Given the option to opt-in to the Mentor Program via interest form

Choose a mentor based on shared interests or allow for automated match



### **NOW OPEN: Mentor Interest Form**

Why now? To formalize and expand OPEN's culture of peer support.

Who are we seeking? Formal Leaders and former Formal Leaders.

What's the commitment? Up to 4 hours with each mentee over 4 months, for up to 3 mentees/year.

What's provided? Mentor Resource Kit, FAQs, support contacts.

Where will mentors be featured? In the new Mentor Directory launching in 2026.

### About the Dental Coverage Committee



**Connect** people and organizations with a shared goal.



**Platform** for advocates to share experiences and lessons learned from efforts to protect adult Medicaid oral health benefits in their states and strengthen Medicare.



**Accelerate** the spread of new strategies and solutions to build upon national progress to enhance Medicaid adult dental benefits and Medicare dental coverage.



**Offer** national perspectives and updates on Congressional and administrative actions.



### Meeting structure and topics

During the first half of the year, meetings typically focus on 'rapid response' as members actively engage in their legislative sessions. In addition to sharing real-time information about their efforts, members present and discuss topics aimed at supporting their advocacy efforts:



- ✓ Expanding/protecting Medicaid adult dental benefits
- ✓ Understanding threats to benefits and programs and developing advocacy and mobilization strategies in response
- ✓ Making the link between oral health and the opioid crisis
- ✓ The role of and ways to leverage grassroots voice in advocacy efforts
- ✓ Expanding the list of treatments approved under medically necessary dental coverage in Medicare
- ✓ Building oral health champions



### Meeting structure and topics (cont'd)

During the second half of the year meetings transition to more formal calls where policy topics and advocacy strategies are presented and discussed in greater depth for use in future policy campaigns. Meeting topics have focused on:



- ✓ Emerging research and on-the-ground experience on effective oral health messaging and strategies to reach multiple audiences
- The impact that insufficient Medicaid adult dental coverage has on oral health care access, utilization, and health outcomes
- ✓ The role managed care organizations can play in covering dental services
- ✓ Educating providers and consumers on dental treatments covered as medically necessary
- ✓ Readying for upcoming elections and new administrations


