What is the Three Domain Framework?





What is the Three Domain Framework?



Tele-Prevention

Domain One builds an accessible evidence-based virtual care delivery approach to accompany oral health care delivery that applies technology for enhanced disease prevention and whole-person health.



Minimally Invasive Care

Domain Two focuses on minimally invasive care that reverses or slows early disease stages using a program of anticipatory guidance and collaborative decision-making with patients.



Integrated and Personalized Care

Domain Three introduces personalized oral health care that prolongs the life of hard and soft tissues by reducing tooth/tissue mortality through risk stratification, medicaldental integration, the utilization of predictive analytics and safe, individualized surgical intervention.



COrHT AIM: What we hope to accomplish


By September 2021, participating health centers will gain experience in a prevention-focused, wholeperson care model described in the *Three Domains Framework* by testing and implementing activities such as:

- Expanded use of telehealth and minimally invasive approaches to prioritize primary and secondary prevention
- Utilization of risk assessment and stratification to enhance population health management and scheduling practices
- Collaboration with DQP to monitor operational and financial data to understand readiness for a
 prevention-focused, whole-person value-based model of care







Data Collection and Reporting Process



Two categories of data will be collected by COrHT Initiative participants:

- 1. Data from Dental EHR/PMS (Clinical and Operational)
- 2. Data from Profit and Loss and Aging Reports (Financial data)

Data will be used to support measurement associated with the COrHT initiative:

 Calculate structured measurements, perform analysis, develop a dashboard of the measures, and communicate with DQP and external teams.

Why Do We Need a Team?

Testing and adopting new ways of delivering care is only successful with the collective work of the team, relying on their diverse knowledge, experience, perspectives and skills.

<u>Please select a few staff from your practice to comprise your COrHT Team.</u> We have outlined the roles below to provide context about the types of responsibilities and activities that will be required of the team in general. Exactly *how* you fill these roles is up to you – as you know your health center and staff best.

- Key Project Contact/Day to Day Leader: The driver of the project, someone who understands the processes of care, and makes sure communication channels are strong to move the work forward. The Day to Day Leader attends COrHT community calls and disseminates information out to health center staff about project work. This person also is the main point of contact for COrHT Project Staff (Note: see description for data manager serving as point of contact for data-related activities).
- Clinical Champion: A clinical professional (preferably a dentist, though not a requirement) who is an engaged member of the project team and attends COrHT Community Calls whenever possible. The Clinical Champion works closely with the Day to Day Leader in "applying the learnings" in the clinical setting by testing new strategies and championing their adoption by clinical staff across the health center.
- Data Manager: The data manager is responsible for project data reporting and serves as the point of contact for data-related activities. The data manager will work with staff at DentaQuest Partnership to extract and transfer the data as part of the project deliverables.
- Senior Leader/Sponsor: while not necessarily involved with the details of project work, the senior leader is aware of project progress and is in communication with project team. This person also liaises with executive management and the Board, takes responsibility for results, negotiates resources, and helps alleviate barriers to progress (e.g. COO or CFO).
